

# Data of Survey Participants


## Age

- 7.1% of people belong to the 40-50 Age Group



- 20.9% of people work in Brick Kilns




### Educational Status






### Monthly Income vs. Expenses

- 66.6% of participants are spending less money than they earn



  - o 11.3% are used as other expenses


## Monthly Money Saving Habits








