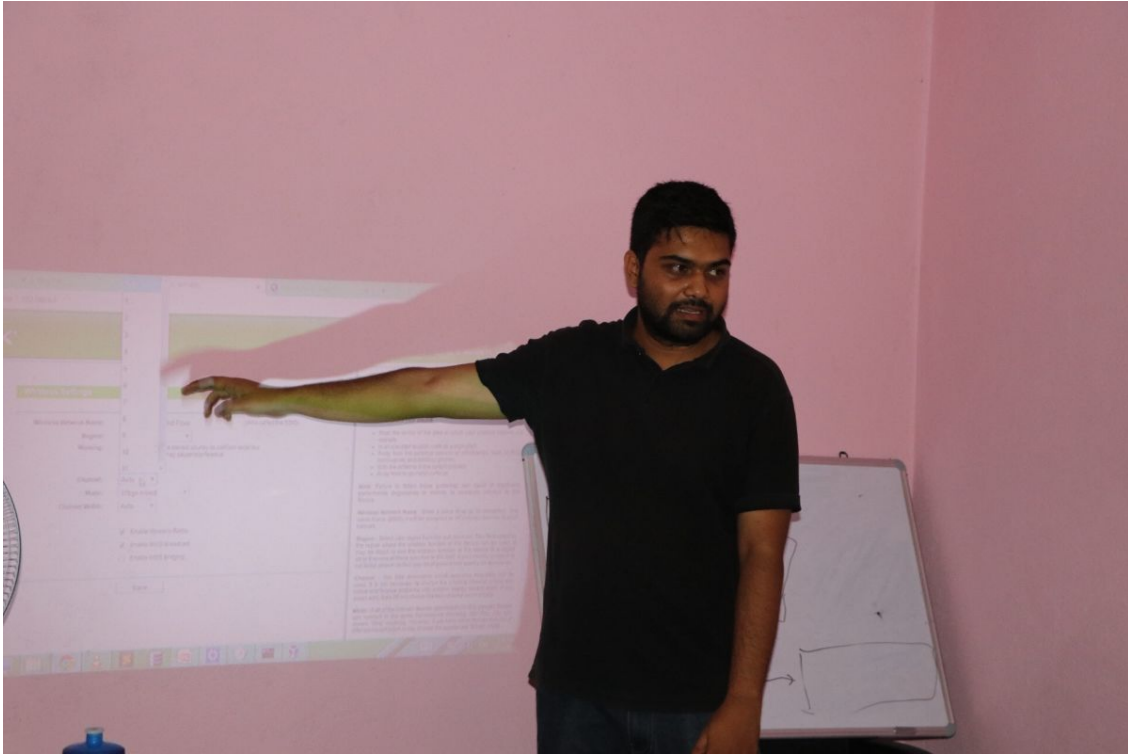




FONAI Education Scholarship Program (FESSHIP)

CANSHIP Code of Conduct for our scholars

We have realized the importance of clarifying the standards of our scholarship program to our scholars. To make this happen, we have prepared a code of conduct for our scholars and have discussed it with them. This initiation enhanced bonding as well as empathy among the scholars and the CANSHIP Team while ensuring the meeting of the standards of this scholarship program.

Workshops for our scholars

Understanding the need of our scholars, that is different in each school, we have started designing and implementing workshops for them with varied objectives of ensuring their growth.

The Bookclub

We kicked off our “BookClub Series” among our scholars of Kanti Ishwori Rajya Laxmi Secondary School on June 4, 2019. This series primarily intended to inculcate the values of reading among the scholars and develop their reading habit. To make it more interesting, we also allowed our scholars to make their own bookmarks through our “Do It Yourself” section of the book reading workshop, which was observed to be exciting for our scholars. Based on the initial assessment done, The Book Club has been successful so far, except in a few cases, where the books chosen by the students were difficult for them. To address this, we have already exchanged the books



as per the levels not difficult to them. We are aiming to launch similar sorts of programs in the other partner schools and promote reading culture among our scholars.

Public Speaking

Shy and timid of sharing information with us have always been obstructing us from getting more insights from our scholars from Balkumari Basic School on June 18, 2019. To make our scholars more open to us and to help them communicate easily with new people, we initiated The Public Speaking workshop for them.



In the session, we gave them basic insights on the importance of communication and also inculcated various interactive activities full of energizers and games to help them ensure better communication. We are glad to see how their reluctance to speak at the beginning of the session turned out to be their willingness to speak towards the end. Our scholars have promised to practice the skills we have introduced to them before the second episode of this public speaking workshop series.

Smart Study Skills

Aiming to the upcoming first terminal examinations, we conducted a Smart Study Skills workshop at Janakalyan Higher Secondary School on June 20, 2019. It basically introduced the concept of mind



mapping and time budgeting skills that helped our scholars to understand faster and better.



In addition to this, they learned to manage time in the most effective way. We are hopeful that our scholars would apply these concepts in their upcoming exams and would get good scores.

Session on CTEVT for our SEE Scholars

There is always confusion in choosing the course of one's choice, particularly when you are in grade 10 and 12, and are expected to decide about your lives. We do not just believe in enhancing the educational attainment in the general streams but also enhancing the opportunity for our scholars by connecting them to the technical courses that will land them to a better career in the future. For this, we conducted a session on the Council for Technical Education and Vocational Training (CTEVT) courses for our SEE scholars.



The session was facilitated by Ms. Bimala Devkota, a representative from CTEVT who clarified our scholars about the opportunities they can grab in CTEVT and how it can benefit them. The session, not only exposed the scholars to the

opportunities in CTEVT but also motivated them to work hard when the facilitator shared her life experiences about how she achieved good things despite her early marriage and family obligations.

Training the Trainers

This June, we had 2 different trainers' training programs at the Canopy Nepal office, Baluwatar. The training was facilitated by Mr. Roshan Bhatta who is a teachers' trainer himself. One of the training was conducted on 6th of June with Deeksha Thapa and Sajina



Maharjan and the other training was conducted on 17th of June with Garima Hisaria and Vinayshree Kothari. To be able to deliver the content and implement the planned activities in a most efficient manner, the training session is conducted. The training will enable the trainees to implement the activities in the most competent way.

Evaluating Our Kids

On June 12, the EIC team conducted a pre-evaluation session with the students of Vijaya Memorial School. The team conducts the pre-evaluation to segregate students according to their level in terms of their speaking, reading and writing skills. The levels reflect the difficulty level in terms of the activity to be conducted. The levels are of 3 strata- level 1: easy, level 2: medium, level 3: advanced. The segregation is essential for the facilitators to teach or deliver their content according to the students' abilities to grasp the learnings. This will enable the facilitators to understand the effort they will have to impart upon the students.

June 19, was the day where the 44th Learners' Hub: EIC session was initiated. The session was facilitated by Garima and Vinayshree. The session was conducted at Vijaya Memorial School, Dillibazar.
