The Responsible Entities of Friends of Nepal - Adelaide Inc. (FONAI) present their report for the year ended 30 June 2022 and the Independent Financial Review thereon.

Principal Activities

During the year, the principal activity of the Association was to administer an Education Scholarship program to provide funding support for post Year 10 education and/or vocational training opportunities for severely disadvantaged Nepali students.

In 2020 FONAl entered into a two-year partnership with Canopy Nepal to manage the FESSHIP program. This decision was made to allow more flexibility in coping with challenges of pandemic and the impact of the scholarship program.

The only changes in this program have been to direct scholarship funds to support students and their families well-being during the extended lockdowns in Nepal.

Outreach Programs

In 2021 FONAI facilitated funding to assist our Nepalese partners Rotary Club of Dillibazaar and the Rotaract Club of Dillibazaar to address COVID19 challenges. We facilitated funding for following projects:

- Thermo Gun purchase and distribution to enable the re-opening of schools inside Kathmandu Valley.
- Covid Isolation Clinic Funding of 12 nurses to work at COVID Isolation Clinic in Kathmandu during COVID peak

FONAI also partnered with NGO chairperson of Cocina Mittho Chai, Debendra Pokharel, and facilitated a fundraising drive to fund medical kits for both family and professional use during the peak of the pandemic. We are pleased to report that we received all required progress and final project reports from our partners which were shared with donors.

In October 2017 FONIA entered into a three year partnership with Child Development Society Nepal to facilitate funding for a Self - Employment Education Program (SEEP) for marginalized and vulnerable women in Nepal. The finalization of this project, originally planned for October 2020, was delayed by COVID 19 pandemic. We are pleased to report that this project was finalized in December 2021 with all required reporting received and shared with our supporters.

In February 2022 FONAI was signatory to a Memorandum of Understanding with the Rotary Clubs of Brownhill Creek and Dillibazar and the Child Development Society for the establishment of a Rotary Australia World Community Service project (RAWCS) to support Self - Employment Education Program (SEEP) for marginalized and vulnerable women in Nepal. To date two groups have been established and are underway.

Our Goals

Our mission is to provide access to senior and post-secondary education to marginalised, socially and economically disadvantaged Nepali youth who otherwise would not have the financial means to fulfil their educational goals.

FONAl views higher education as a catalyst, an agent of change for individuals, families and communities.

To succeed in our mission we:

- Promote and provide financial support for senior and post-secondary education via an education scholarship program (FESSHIP)
- Assure that students have all the information and support necessary to make sound educational and financial decisions about their futures
- Lead a collaborative network of educational partners aligned to support student selection, preparation, transition and persistence to course completion.
