Responsible Entities' Report

The Responsible Entities of Friends of Nepal - Adelaide Inc. (FONAI) present their report for the year ended 30 June 2023 and the Independent Financial Review thereon.

Responsible Entities details

Principal Activities

In 2022 FONAI entered the second of a two-year partnership with Canopy Nepal to manage the FESSHIP program. During the year, the principal activity of the Association was to administer an Education Scholarship program to provide funding support for post Year 10 education and/or vocational training opportunities for severely disadvantaged Nepali students.

The 2022-2023 FESSHIP program had sixteen (16) students, six (6) completing senior high school levels, years 11 and 12, three (3) completing vocational training, Diploma level, and eight (8) completing graduate studies at university. Over the course of the year two (2) students graduated, one (1) with a Bachelor of Developmental Finance and one (1) with Year 12 and barista training. One (1) student exited the program in the first semester, after receiving a full scholarship to attend the Women's University in Bangladesh and one (1) secured partial scholarship support to attend the Nepalese Army of Medical Science. The remaining students are completing their Bachelor studies in fields ranging from Computer Science to Business Studies.



Our Canopy FESSHIP management team continues to manage the program in a very professional and successful manner. The team places a strong emphasis on ensuring the students have all the information and support they need to make sustainable choices about their futures and prioritizes student well-being for all current and past FESSHIP students. In 2022-2023 the FESSHIP program maintained its 100% success rate in retention of students and completion of chosen studies due to the excellent management of this team and we are very grateful to them.





Outreach Programs

In 2022 FONAI facilitated funding from the Rotary Club of Lindisfarne in Tasmania to support the following projects.



Donation to the RAWCS project 101-2018-19: Self Employment Education Program (SEEP) Child Development Society, Kathmandu, Nepal (RAOAF)

This project is managed by the Rotary Club of Mitcham in South Australia and the Rotary Club of Dillibazaar in Nepal and is implemented by the Child Development Society (CDS) in Kathmandu, Nepal.

Using RAWCS funds the Child Development Society conducted two groups, one in the district of Himal and one in the district of Sagarmatha, and forty-one (41) marginalised women successfully completed the SEEP program. Businesses established include quail and fish farming, small grocery shops and tailoring.

All required reporting for this project has been received and shared with our supporters.





EIC is a skill enhancement program run by our partners Canopy Nepal. The program targets marginalized students and focuses on enhancing reading, writing, speaking, listening, critical and creative thinking skills through interactive learning. Twenty-five (25) marginalised students attended this four (4) month program which identified and targeted individual student skill gaps and provided students with ongoing mentoring and support.

All required reporting for this project has been received and shared with our supporters.

Our Goals

Our mission is to provide access to senior and post-secondary education to marginalised, socially and economically disadvantaged Nepali youth who otherwise would not have the financial means to fulfil their educational goals.

FONAI views higher education as a catalyst, an agent of change for individuals, families and communities.

To succeed in our mission we:

- Promote and provide financial support for senior and post-secondary education via an education scholarship program (FESSHIP)
- Assure that students have all the information and support necessary to make sound educational and financial decisions about their futures
- Lead a collaborative network of educational partners aligned to support student selection, preparation, transition and persistence to course completion.
